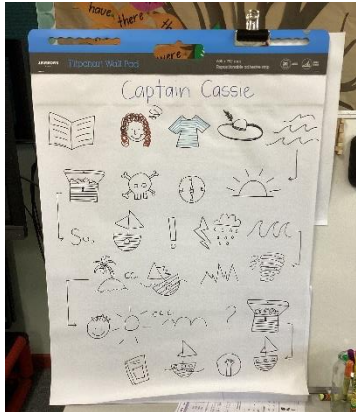

In Science we have been learning about plants and animals and what living things need to survive.

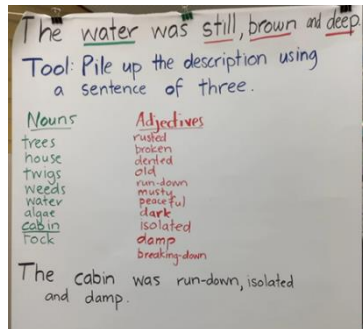


In Design and Technology we designed and built boats using items within the school.

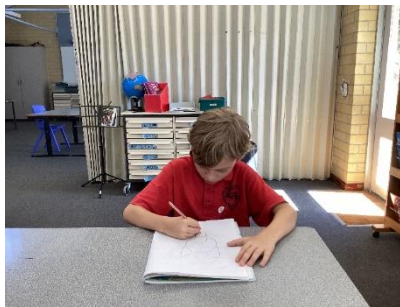


Senior Room News

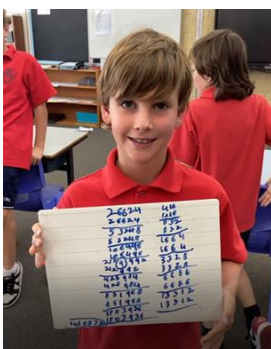
This term in the Senior Class, have been learning the tools needed for writing a narrative. Their learning has been based in the 'Talk for Writing' approach, created by Pie Corbett. We have had fun learning a model text called *The Creek*. The writing tools allow students to see how a model text uses tools to create a certain aspect of writing. Our focus has been on setting. Students have applied the tools to make innovations to the original text and are working towards a new text created by themselves.



We have been studying a story called *Idjhil* for our Reading lessons. *Idjhil* is set in the Swan Valley region during the 1940's and the story deals with circumstances around the stolen generation. Through this text we have been learning some Noongar words and art symbols, as well as learning about the history of Ngoongar Boodja.



Maths has been all about addition and subtraction this term. The students are learning a variety of different strategies for solving addition and subtraction problems. They are learning that some strategies fit certain numbers better than others and will work towards being able to choose the best strategy for a particular problem.



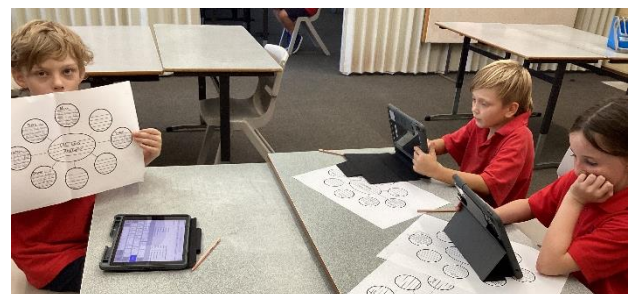
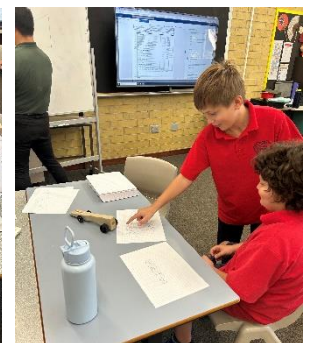
This term in Art, students have been creating a sculpture using recycled materials. They have been planning and designing artwork that can be created using items such as cardboard boxes, bottles, lids, and other resources.



In Science with SIDE, the students have been learning about the water cycle. The students have used plastic bags with coloured water and exposed them to sunlight, to see the water cycle.



In Design and Technology, the students have been researching and beginning to design their CO2 cars in preparation for the annual CO2 Car Race later this year.



From the Principals Desk

The weather has certainly changed very quickly and the mornings have become a lot colder. It has been wonderful to see the children wearing their winter school uniforms. These are available to be purchased through the P&C at the front office with both new and some second hand uniforms available.

Students have been reading and recording the weather this term for the Scitech Weather Wall and our readings are announced on the 7 News Regional (GWN) news on Wednesday nights. We have the opportunity to share a photo or a video in Week 6 and 9. Thank you to Teresa Deering for making time to teach the students how to read the rain gauge at school.

In February 2024, The Cook Government announced the rollout of an innovative software platform named Kaartdijn into Western Australian public schools by mid-2026. Leeman Primary School's turn has arrived and our roll-out is currently in process. This means over the next 12 months (possibly longer) there will be significant changes in the way schools collect, use, store and share student data and information.

One of the biggest changes that will impact parents is the change of text communications via SMS. Communications from the school from the 24th of June will be from Leeman PS and cannot be replied to.
