Junior Class News

The students would like to thank all the families and community members who attended their assembly before the Biggest Morning Tea in Week 4. It was wonderful to share their learning with everyone.

In Week 5 the students enjoyed travelling to Eneabba to participate in a range of NAIDOC activities. On Thursday, they will also celebrate Book Week by dressing up as their favourite storybook characters.

This term, the students have begun music lessons with Mr Fuller. They have been exploring high and low sounds using bells and practising how to keep the beat.





In English, the Year 1 and 2 students have started learning how to write information reports, beginning with a topic on honeybees. They have also been working on the concept of the 'bossy e' and how it changes short vowels into long vowels.



The Pre-Primary students have focused on the letters I, e, n, g, k, and u and have started taking home reading books. The Kindergarten students have been exploring the sounds m, s, t, and a, as well as learning rhyming words.

In Mathematics, the students have been learning about chance and probability, using words such as certain, likely, unlikely, impossible, possible, might, and maybe. They have also been working on making, drawing, and counting equal groups and arrays as an introduction to multiplication.

In Science, the students planted cauliflower, spinach, broccoli, and beans in the vegetable garden and are eager to watch them grow. They also created detailed drawings of honeybees, labelling the different parts, which are now proudly displayed.















In Art, the students have completed their landscape collages, which will be featured in the Cervantes Art Show.










In Physical Education, the focus is on preparing for the athletics carnival in Week 7, with plenty of practice and training underway.

Senior Class News

Maths

One area of focus so far this term has been the subject of angles. The students have learned about the names we use for different types of angles, compared their size, looked for angles in their environment, and used protractors to measure the size of angles in degrees. They have also enjoyed playing "Which One Doesn't Belong", as a warm-up activity, where students decide on which one out of four samples is the odd one out. There can be several reasonable answers. You can see an example below.



English

The language of persuasion has been our focus in English to start term 3. Students studied various advertisements in poster or leaflet form and learned different techniques to persuade a reader. They have had the opportunity to create their own poster that advertises a product or service, using techniques such as questions, exaggerations, and slogans to persuade the reader.

Science

In Science, the students have begun the topic of Earth and Space. The Year 3 students have been investigating some facts and ideas about the sun. It was mind blowing to find out the big numbers relating to the sun. Did you know that 1.3 million Earths could fit inside the sun?



Music

The Senior Class students began music lessons this term and have been exploring the sounds that different instruments can make. They have learned about instrument families (e.g. brass, woodwind, string and percussion) and tuned their ears to the sounds by playing a quiz to guess which instrument they heard. They have been learning how to read and play rhythmic patterns using percussion instruments. It has been exciting finding out what knowledge and skills the students have and pleasing to hear music back in Leeman classrooms.
