

Senior Class News

Maths

This term the Senior Class has been spending plenty of time trying to memorise Basic Maths Facts. In particular, students have been learning their times tables facts. Each student completed an activity to see which tables they needed to work on first. From there we devised a training routine to help memorise facts. The routine included chanting the table, writing it out on a whiteboard, finding patterns in the table, completing a timed test, partner testing, and some online activities. When students were ready, they could attempt a test to see if they had mastered the table. They then moved on to a new times table. The routine produced significant success.





Music

The pleasure of music continues to fill our classroom this semester. It has been a treat to watch the students engage in musical activities. For example, the students have been listening and responding to music such as *The Planet Suite*. This music was written by Gustav Holtz, who was inspired by his fascination with the planets. Next term the students will have a chance to plan their own composition based around a planet, using their knowledge of rhythm, tempo, instrumentation and pitch.

The students also had the opportunity to learn, rehearse and perform a piece of music for an audience. They learned a song called *Hello There*, which they sang and then played on musical instruments such as glockenspiels, boom-whackers, bells, and xylophones. The performance took place at the assembly where they were joined by some of the year 2 students who helped with singing.



Art

In Art the students investigated an artist named Gotti Lotti who painted nature using drips of watercolour as well as other techniques. Students had to choose either a cockatoo or a budgie and create artwork in the style of Grotti Lotti. They were able to use acrylic paint, watercolour and posca markers.



Science

The students have been exploring varied topics in Science. Year 4's have been studying Chemical Science, where they had to design and make toys by considering elastic properties.



The Year 3's have been exploring space and the planets. They conducted an experiment to see if they could capture invisible ultraviolet light. This was achieved by using tonic water. The quinine in tonic water gives ultraviolet light a blue tinge.

On Monday, 8th September, our students travelled to Badgingarra to take part in a combined Faction Athletics Carnival. The event brought students together for a day of friendly competition, team spirit, and athletic achievement.
